Programme Outline

This session provides an in-depth exploration of the intersection between finance, sustainability, and climate action. Participants will gain an understanding of the latest developments around green and transition taxonomies - reflecting also on the development in Hong Kong – and how those taxonomies can help accelerate the journey towards Net Zero. In a second part, the session also explores the corresponding low-carbon solutions, identifying the most promising investment opportunities across the greentech ecosystem.

Speaker Introduction

The speaker holds a PhD in Renewable Energy Management and master's degrees in international management and accounting and finance from the University of St. Gallen and the London School of Economics. He serves as Adjunct Assistant Professor for Climate Solutions at HKUST and is a lecturer in other sustainability executive education programmes and MBA modules focusing on climate change related topics. Outside of academia, he helps to lead the Climate & Sustainability team at Deloitte Hong Kong where he leads various projects in the field of sustainability and climate change for a wide range of industries - topics include sustainable finance, climate risks, consumer preferences, developing new low-carbon business models as well as decarbonisation strategies and pathways.


