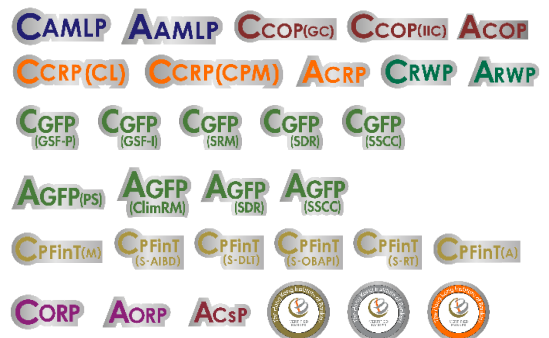
Speaker Introduction
